Item 2. To consider and adopt Minutes of the July Meeting held on 17th July 2025	It was proposed by Cllr. Bonfield and seconded by Cllr. Quirke O'Meara and resolved that the minutes of the July Meeting held on 17 th July 2025 be adopted.
Item 3. To consider and adopt Minutes of the Special Meeting held on 1st August 2025	It was proposed by Cllr. Quirke O'Meara and seconded by Cllr. Bonfield and resolved that the minutes of the special Meeting held on 1 st August 2025 be adopted.
Item 4. To receive update from Environment & Climate Action	<p>The report from Environment was circulated to members.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler requested an update on Boher Burial Ground and the next round of the Climate Action Fund. Cllr. J.P. O'Meara asked if the number of horses picked up and not reclaimed to date this year was in line with the normal amount. Cllr. Quirke O'Meara enquired about the Burgess Burial Ground and signage for illegal dumping in the Silvermines.</p> <p>Cllr. Morris raised the issue of a horse on council land at Stereame. He asked if a discharge pipe at the back to the old rugby club into the Clareen Stream was licensed and raised concerns about possible leaking cells in Ballaghveny.</p> <p>Cllr. Carroll stated that the illegal parking at the attenuation pond off the M7 is very concerning. It is an environmental issue and he has contacted TII but is not getting any answer. Cllr. Morgan</p>



	<p>Walsh raised concerns over fly tipping especially along the road at Coolaholloga and asked if there was a reason why more dog fouling bins cannot be put along popular walking routes.</p> <p>Mr. R. Boland explained that the boundary and carpark at Boher are nearing completion and it will be followed by the finishing work of gates, surfacing etc. The pipes have been purchased for the work at Burgess Burial Ground.</p> <p>Mr. M. Moroney said that the next round for the Climate Action Fund is expected at the end of October with a closing date in mid-December. The amount of horses picked up so far in 2025 would be in the normal range and it is not unusual that they are not re-claimed. They will look at the situation about the horse at Stereame. He will ask the water team to contact Cllr. Morris about the discharge pipe. Contractors are currently being appointed for the work at Ballaghveny for the remedial work on the old part of the landfill and the new part will be in line with current standards. The work should be commencing before the end of the year. Anti-littering signage is available to provide to groups or the District. If there is a particular area of concern for dog fouling the dog warden can visit and ordinary bins can be used for the disposal of dog fouling bags.</p>
Item 5. To receive update from LAWPRO	<p>The report from LAWPRO was circulated to members.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler asked who will maintain the new landscape areas for nature based solutions. Cllr. Carroll acknowledged the work of LAWPRO and the success of the Farming for Water. He would encourage the wider community to get involved in these schemes as everyone has a role to play. Cllr. Morris enquired about Citizens Science that was previously mentioned. Cllr. Hannigan asked how more people could be encouraged under the EIP scheme.</p> <p>Ms. R. Hennessey explained that LAWPRO administers the EIP scheme for which there is funding of €50m available. It covers areas where rivers are impacted by agriculture. They work with advisors from the Co-Ops, Teagasc and the farmers to put appropriate measures in place. The maintenance of nature based solutions would be under the remit of the Local Authority but in some areas, tidy towns or community groups would be involved. The Community Water Officer has a training programme for Citizen Science and she will ask for the details to be sent on to members.</p>

Newport Town Park:

- Site walk through by consultants and contractors held and further meeting planned for two weeks to finalise sign off.

Newport Town Team/Newport Town Centre First Plan:

- Newport Town Centre First Plan was agreed at the May meeting of Nenagh MD. The Plan will now form the basis for agreeing an Action Plan to progress implementation based on priorities and resources.
- Meeting of Newport Town Team to be arranged.

Nenagh Town Team/Town Centre First/THRIVE:

- Copies of the Nenagh Town Centre First Plan are now available.
- Claim for THRIVE funding allocated for preparation of the TCF Plan in course of preparation.
- Meeting of Nenagh Town Team to be arranged and action plan to be developed.
- Agreement reached with Nenagh Guardian to provide updates in relation to the Nenagh Town Team and the TCF Plan on a regular basis.



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- Feedback given to Image ICT Solutions Ltd., T/A Storm Web Development on the revised proposals for logo for Nenagh.ie. Refinements received and currently being assessed.
- New mural at Emmet Place by artist Neil O' Dwyer has now been completed following finalisation of agreement with the property owners. This mural links with the previous mural dedicated to the late Shane MacGowan. The words and images combine to celebrate 'The Broad Majestic Shannon'. A lot of positive feedback has been received on this mural. Both murals, together with Nenagh Tourist Office, feature in the brochure launched as part of the 'Broad Majestic Shannon' Festival.

Rialto Digital & Enterprise Hub:

Work is progressing on exploring the potential funding sources based on proposed use of the Rialto.

Nenagh Town Park Extension

- Following a tender process Lead Engineer, Ecologist and Landscaper have been appointed to prepare a concept design for the extension of Nenagh Town Park with a view to progressing to planning stage.
- Design on going – first draft of ecologist reports/screening and civil/structural drawings completed.
- Landscaper to submit options.
- Aim is to submit for Planning by end of October 2025.



Nenagh Historic and Cultural Quarter

- Works are in progress on the conservation works to the windows and doors of the Governor's House funded under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme and the GMA. These are scheduled for completion before end of October.
- Application has been submitted to the Department under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme in respect of the 3-storey Gaol Block with a view to securing funding to allow this historic heritage building to be brought back into public use. Awaiting decision on same.
- We will continue to strive to source funding for the various proposals in relation to the Historic & Cultural Quarter as funding calls open up.

Nenagh Centre of Excellence:

- Work has commenced on initial design and the red-line boundary for the development has been agreed with the design team.
- Discussions are on-going with the property owners.
- It is aimed to submit planning through Part 8 process in Q4 2025/Q1 2026.
- Meetings are being held fortnightly with the Integrated Design Team.

Nenagh Transport Hub:

Engagement with NTA on the development of a Transport Hub and the proposed relocation of the bus stops to the Railway Station is on-going.

Platforms for Growth- Dromineer:

- A ceremony to mark the commencement of construction was held on 24th July 2025 on site in Dromineer.
- Work is progressing on site.
- Fortnightly meetings are being held on site with consultants and contractors.
- Proposals for Part 8 Changing Places Facility were approved at special meeting held on 1st August 2025.
- An assessment of the accessibility to and from the new facility has been undertaken. Approval in principle to funding for specified measures has been indicated by Fáilte Ireland. The works applied for include induction loop in the WAC, footpaths and associated works, bike stand, pedestrian crossings, street furniture/rest points and resurfacing of carpark with line markings, bays, etc. Funding provided for this will be to a maximum of €161,000. Discussions are currently on-going at District level on delivery of these measures, first draft of car park design received and consultation on same has taken place with local community.



Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2022

- Ballina Access Promenade and Viewing Area – Project Complete and funding has been drawn down from the Department. The project was officially opened by the Cathaoirleach of Tipperary County Council, Councillor John Carroll on 2nd September 2025.
- Newport Courthouse and Bridewell Complex –Part 8 planning was approved at the June meeting of Nenagh MD. Project Development Measures project is now complete and funding has been drawn down for same.

Casual Trading Bye-Laws

- To date, for the 2025 casual trading year we have received 14 applications for the designated areas in the Nenagh Municipal District. Of these 14 applications a total of 12 licences were issued with the remaining two applications not progressing as decided by the applicants. No Event licences have been issued to date for 2025.
- Note that Applications for 2026 casual trading licences will be advertised in the coming weeks with closing date for receipt of completed applications circa 1st November 2025.

Expressions of Interests for Development Land at Lisbunny

The disposals to Banaghan & Co (Stationery) Ltd and Apex Aviation approved by members at the October plenary meeting are being progressed by the Central Property Unit. It is the Council's intention to upgrade the roadway within this development.

Designated Bathing Area

The application has been submitted to the EPA for the designation of the bathing area in Dromineer. Interviews for lifeguards were held but unfortunately there wasn't sufficient numbers to provide a lifeguard service in 2025. This will be revisited in 2026. The provision of facilities for lifeguards will also be progressed.

Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme:

- Measure One 2023 – Castlough Amenity Area Improvement Works. Three BBQ areas have been installed and we are awaiting finalisation of a small amount of outstanding work.
- Measure One 2023 – Upper Lough Derg Tranquility Area (Mota & Skehanagh). Works are now complete.
- Project Development Measures 2022 – Garrykennedy Inner Harbour. Planning application was submitted in July to An Coimisiún Pleanála. This project is now complete as the planning application has been submitted. We have been invited by An Coimisiún Pleanála to submit our observations on the four submissions received. Should planning approval be received funding will be sought for the works involved.
- Clare Glens Project Development Measure – A planning application has been submitted to An Coimisiún Pleanála. Four submissions were received following the public consultation period and we have now submitted our observations on these



submissions to An Coimisiún Pleanála. This project is now complete as the planning application has been submitted and we await the outcome of same. Should planning approval be received funding will be sought for the work involved.

Measure 3 of the Town Centre First Suite of Supports 2024

An amount of €45,000 has been allocated under Measure 3 of the Town Centre First Suite of Supports 2024. This is for Project Development Measure Funding for Newport. The project will examine the development of a connection from the historic Ball Alley site with the town centre and ancillary public realm and amenity works through the provision of a footbridge. Project elements include the engagement of a multidisciplinary team to complete detailed design, planning, professional fees and a topographical survey. Survey works are now complete. Design Team has been appointed and are working on going to Planning in September. Draft planning pack circulated internally for comment and Design Team are currently reviewing comments received. A Section 50 application has been made to OPW for approval to put bridge over the river.

Participation Nation Outdoor Fund

Funding has been secured under the Participation Nation Outdoor Fund in conjunction with Sports Partnership for the installation of 3x3 Basketball Court and biodiversity measures at St. Paul's Playground, Nenagh. This is one of three projects funded in Tipperary under this programme. Tender processes have been undertaken in conjunction with the other locations in Tipperary. The contract has now been awarded for the basketball courts and works will now be progressed. It is anticipated that work will commence in Nenagh during the week beginning 29th September 2025. Meeting has been held with the Biodiversity Officer in relation to the siting of the biodiversity area.

Entente Florale Europe Competition 2025

Judging took place on Friday 11th July in Terryglass. The results of this competition will be announced in Slovenia at the end of September.

15 applications were received under the Painting & Enhancement Scheme for Terryglass. 9 have been paid to date and documentation is awaited from the remainder.

2025 Painting & Enhancement Scheme:

37 applications have been received to date in respect of locations other than Terryglass. 35 have received provisional approval and 6 applicants have been paid to date. We are awaiting completion of works and submission of receipts and photographs from the remaining applicants.



Nenagh Tourist Office:

For Heritage Week 2025 Nenagh Tourist Office co-ordinated 10 separate events with the assistance of Nenagh Heritage Centre, the Courts Service and Nenagh Castle. In total 445 attended the heritage week events in Nenagh Historic & Cultural Quarter over the week and very positive feedback was received on the range and quality of events, with something on offer for everyone – young and old, visitor and local.

During Dromineer Nenagh Literary Festival Nenagh Tourist Office will host two workshops on Saturday 11th October.

Plans in relation to Christmas in the Historic & Cultural Quarter are currently being formalised.

Permits for use of Jetty in Ballina:

One application has been issued for use of the floating jetty in Ballina.

Bus Stop Enhancement Programme:

In total €500,000 has been allocated to Tipperary County Council under the Bus Stop Enhancement Programme. Details of locations in the Nenagh MD were previously advised. Works on the bus stops will be progressed over the next few weeks. The installation of the shelters will not take place until after Christmas as the shelters have to come from abroad.

Grant Schemes:

- Payments have been made to all 66 Burial Ground applicants.
- Provisional approval has been granted to 32 Tidy Towns groups. We are waiting submission of reports and receipts so that payment can be made. Six have been paid to date.
- Payments have been made to 41 of the 46 Residents Associations, with the remainder awaiting documentation from the applicants.
- Payment has been made to 84 of the 90 applications received under the Contributions to Clubs and Organisations grant. One is due to be paid in the next payrun and documentation is awaited from the remaining applicants.
- Grant offers have been made to 26 Festivals & Events applications. Ten have been paid to date and three are due to be paid in the next payrun. We are awaiting some festivals/events to take place and submission of reports and receipts so that payment can be made.

Civic Reception:

Civic Reception was hosted by members of Nenagh MD on Friday 12th September 2025 to mark the achievements in the 2024/2025 season of Nenagh Ormond RFC.

Ms. R. Joyce informed members that the Tourist Office will be circulating the "Unravelling Shane MacGowan" brochure. From 5



	<p>o'clock the previous evening to 9 o'clock this morning 100 emails from many different countries were received requesting a copy of the brochure. A number of people indicated their intention to travel to the area. There is huge potential with this trail. The new mural of "Broad Majestic Shannon" was also recently completed. She acknowledged the support offered by members through the various grant schemes and their support on progressing murals. All the members complimented the work the 'Broad Majestic Shannon' Festival and the brochure which had been produced. Members also complimented the successful Taste of Nenagh event.</p> <p>It was agreed that Cllr. J. Hannigan as Leas Chathaoirleach and Carmel Ormond, Lough Derg Tourism Officer would travel to Slovenia to support Terryglass for the announcement of the results of the Entente Florale Europe Competition.</p>
Item 8. To update members on the Works Programme.	<p>The update on the Works Programme was circulated to members.</p> <p>Mr. B. Murphy explained that the road works programme is 95% complete and a 3 or 4 day break in the weather is required to finish out the recycling programme. 4 extra schemes were approved under LIS and the preparation work for these will be completed by the end of September/start of October.</p> <p>Cllr. Carroll asked that people be patient when road works are being done and was concerned about the abuse given to the outdoor workers. He asked about a start date for the re-alignment at Latteragh and if the work on tertiary roads could be completed once it has started.</p> <p>Cllr. Quirke O'Meara enquired about the possibility of pedestrian crossing and bus stops in Kilcommon progressing at the same time, the active travel scheme for Newtown, the embankment work under Climate Change and the possibility of engineering solutions to reduce the speed in Templederry. She thanked the staff for the help in getting a solution to the parking problems at Ballinaclough School.</p> <p>Cllr. J.P. O'Meara raised the issue of reducing the speed limit or signage/traffic calming on a section of the Nenagh/Cloughjordan Road. He asked about the public lighting in Ballycommon and pedestrian crossings along Sarsfield St and at Centra. He recently met with residents and business owners and the introduction of pedestrian crossings would help pedestrians and slow down traffic. Better signage is also required to direct heavy goods vehicles to take the correct route on the one way system at Emmet Place.</p> <p>Cllr. Bonfield asked about the section of the R503 that is remaining to be completed and the need to keep the inlets open for the winter months to ensure water stays off the roads. Cllr.</p>



	<p>Morris requested an update on the refurbishment of the machinery yard and a CIS scheme for a through road at Ballintotty. Cllr. Hannigan also raised the pedestrian crossing at Centra, the crossing at Kenyon St and the importance of replacing tourism signage at areas where the ditches have been cut.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler was concerned about the 7 houses in Kilmastulla that were flooded in July, her understanding is that funding has been allocated for work but she asked that contact be made with the OPW and the Minister to address this issue. There are drainage issues on the Boher Road and speeding on the Grange Road. Cllrs. Carroll and Bonfield supported the need for work at Kilmastulla.</p> <p>All the members complimented the work of Paul Keane, Executive Engineer, wished him the best in his new role and said it would be great if he came back to the Municipal District in the future.</p> <p>Mr. B. Murphy agreed with the members comments on Mr. P. Keane. He was involved in a number of significant projects in the District, the one way system in Nenagh and the bridge in Ballina and would have a solutions based approach to jobs.</p> <p>While there has been incidents of abuse to staff, 99.9% of people support the work. Reports have been made to Gardaí in a small number of cases.</p> <p>In relation to speeding, enforcement is for the Gardai but people have to be educated that speeding is not acceptable. The possibility of reducing the speed limit on a section of road can be examined and he will speak to Cllr. J.P. O'Meara after the meeting to discuss the exact area. He is not aware of any commitment in relation to the road at Ballintotty but will look at it if there are further details available. Pedestrian crossings are very expensive to put in place and there is no direct source of funding for them. When the road works programme is complete as many inlets as possible will be cleared from October/November to March.</p> <p>Mr. B. Murphy has a report that is to be submitted to the OPW on the tributary in question in Kilmastulla. It is not part of the drainage district and falls outside the Council's remit. Grange Road can be put forward as a location of interest for a low cost safety scheme.</p> <p>Mr. L. Brett explained that the Council can only commit to writing to the OPW in relation to Kilmastulla and can have a liaison role but the work required is not within the statutory functions of the Council.</p> <p>Mr. K. Malone notified members that the tender documents and costings for the refurbishment of the machinery yard are currently being finalised.</p>
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Item 9. To note Engineer's Checklist on roads matters	<p>The checklist was circulated to members and noted.</p> <p>Cllr. Bugler raised the issues of the outfalls on the Portroe Road, signs for Millennium Cross and flooding at Kilkeary. Cllr. Bonfield asked about the bad bend at the depot at Cragg and signage at Kilmore Burial Ground.</p> <p>Mr. B. Murphy explained that a solution at Cragg would be very expensive but signage and road markings may help.</p>
Item 10. To consider Notices of Motion	<p>Notice of Motion No: 3018 submitted by Cllr. F. Bonfield That Tipperary County Council design and seek funding for a traffic calming scheme in Newport Town following on from numerous motions, representations, speed violations in the town and the fact that we have rolled out raised crossings in other towns and villages in the county.</p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3018 was proposed by Cllr. Bonfield and seconded by Cllr. Carroll.</p> <p>Response was given to Cllr. Bonfield as follows:</p> <p><i>The District Engineer will prepare a costed traffic calming scheme for Newport. Funding of the scheme is the primary issue. Departmental grants are not currently available. Own funds would not be sufficient to fund a large scheme such as this. Future funding opportunities will be monitored.</i></p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3026 submitted by Cllr. S. Morris That Nenagh MD immediately implement the necessary loops on the traffic lights at Tyone to ensure they function effectively, as there have been ongoing concerns that they are not currently meeting the needs of all road users. I recognize the efforts already made to improve local traffic safety, and I believe this adjustment would address outstanding issues and improve satisfaction within the community.</p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3026 was proposed by Cllr. Morris and seconded by Cllr. J.P. O'Meara.</p> <p>Response was given to Cllr. Morris as follows:</p> <p><i>The traffic lights loops at Tyone were commissioned in July 2025 following the completion of the Primary Health Care Centre.</i></p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3027 submitted by Cllr. J.P. O'Meara That this Municipal District would write to the Minister for Transport requesting that he introduce a funding scheme for the maintenance and improvement of existing footpaths, and the development of new footpaths.</p>



	<p>I propose that this scheme should operate similar to the current roads funding programme, whereby the Municipal District can set a multi-annual footpaths maintenance and improvement plan, giving County Councillors direct input into the design of this plan, thereby providing more funding certainty for works to be carried out on footpaths in our towns and villages, and allow us to set a clear roadmap for how we will improve our footpaths infrastructure over the coming years. I further propose that part of this work must include a survey of all footpaths in our towns and villages in the Municipal District so that each footpath can be graded, similar to the work done on surveying our roads as part of the roads programmes.</p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3027 was proposed by Cllr. J.P. O'Meara and seconded by Cllr. Carroll.</p> <p>Response was given to Cllr. J.P. O'Meara as follows:</p> <p><i>Considerable work has been undertaken both at District level and at county level on the maintenance and improvement of footpaths and the development of new footpaths however these works have to be prioritised based on the availability of resources.</i></p> <p><i>A dedicated funding programme which would allow a multi-annual footpaths maintenance and improvement plan to be implemented would be welcome. This is not a matter that is specific to Nenagh Municipal District and a call on the Department of Transport to introduce such a funding scheme would be more appropriate to be considered at plenary level. Should the members agree, we will forward the motion for consideration by Tipperary County Council at plenary level.</i></p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3031 submitted by Cllr. F. Bonfield I call on Tipperary County Council to carry out an inspection on the Cully Road from Ahane Cross up towards Cully Cross and arrange for some proper maintenance to be carried out here. We need to arrange for a proper job on this section of road. Residents up here were given a commitment that a job was going to be arranged here with regards to drainage works about two years ago but there has nothing been done since.</p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3031 was proposed by Cllr. Bonfield and seconded by Cllr. Bugler.</p> <p>Response was given to Cllr. Bonfield as follows:</p> <p><i>The road has been inspected by Council staff and there is a requirement for a drainage scheme. This scheme will be prioritised in 2026 as part of the Nenagh Municipal Drainage works.</i></p>
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The road is not on the current 3 year Roads Improvement Works but will be considered for the follow on 3 year programme. Routine Maintenance will continue to be carried out on Cully Road

Notice of Motion No: 3032 submitted by Cllr. S. Morris

That the Nenagh MD could ask the Department of Local Government to consider our district as a trial location for bringing certain services back in-house, such as house maintenance and grass cutting. Over the years, local government has seen a reduction in the range of services managed directly. Restoring control over areas like house maintenance, house retrofitting, tree cutting, grass cutting, and drain maintenance would be a significant asset, especially given the shortage of skilled apprentices. As we prepare for the transition of water services, Nenagh MD could serve as a template for other districts by piloting full-time, locally based repair and maintenance teams. With Nenagh to become the National Retrofit centre of the country it would tie in perfectly to have our own retrofit qualified team in house. We have tried and failed with privatising Grass cutting as the quality of grass cutting has been atrocious. This approach would strengthen our capacity to respond to community needs and set a positive example for other areas.

Notice of Motion No: 3032 was proposed by Cllr. Morris and seconded by Cllr. Carroll.

Response was given to Cllr. Morris as follows:

Decisions on service delivery are primarily a matter for the local authority subject to availability of budgetary and human resources and adherence to applicable national and local policies.

A National Local Democracy Taskforce has been established which is tasked with finalising a programme for the reform of local government in Ireland. The Taskforce's work is organised into four key pillars of Structure, Finance, Functions and Governance/Accountability. Members will have the opportunity to make submissions to the Taskforce on these areas. The call for such submissions is not yet open.

Suggestions with regard to changes in structures and/or proposals for establishment of pilot models would most appropriately be considered in the context of submissions by members to the Taskforce.

Notice of Motion No: 3033 submitted by Cllr. F. Bonfield

Can we arrange to see if we can look at some traffic calming measures on a small length of road at the entrance into Marian Estate in Newport as there is a problem of cars gaining speed because the length of road in question is on a slope downwards, and cars at not staying at the 30 km per hour.



	<p>Notice of Motion No: 3033 was proposed by Cllr. Bonfield and seconded by Cllr. Bugler.</p> <p>Response was given to Cllr. Bonfield as follows:</p> <p><i>The enforcement of speed control within the Marian Estate is a matter for An Garda Síochána.</i></p> <p><i>The District Engineer will consider funding opportunities for traffic calming measures as they materialise.</i></p> <p>Notice of Motion No: 3034 submitted by Cllr. S.
