Creative Ireland Grant Schemes 2026

The Tipperary Creative Ireland grant schemes 2026 are now open for applications.

The Creative Ireland programme is a culture based programme, the vision of the Creative Ireland Programme 2023 - 2027 is to mainstream culture and creativity in the life of the nation so that individually and collectively, we can realise our full creative potential thereby promoting individual, community and national wellbeing.

There are two distinct grant schemes:

Tipperary Creative Ireland Community grant scheme 2026

This scheme can accommodate applications from community groups, festivals and not for profit organisations to support in providing participatory culture based activities and projects.

Funding is between €500 - €3,500.

Tipperary Creative Ireland Project Award 2026

This call is open to all cultural & creative practitioners in the county; Crafts people, Historians, Archaeologists, Archivists, Folklorists, Curators, Artists, Writers, Performers, along with not for profit and community organisations. The funding for this scheme is between €3,500 - €15,000 maximum. We are open to receiving applications for projects which may extend over a year or two which may be of longer-term benefit to the community, however these applications should clearly outline the progress achievable in each year.

Projects in this category should create a lasting positive legacy for the community and participants.

The lead applicant in any application must be a Traveller organisation or a Traveller Primary Health Care project. All projects must have a creative practitioner involved and the programme particularly welcomes partnerships with Traveller artist or creative practitioners.

Two strands of funding are available:

Strand A €5,000—€9,999
Strand B €10,000—€20,000

The Trench Award 2026



Applications are now invited from emerging singers and instrumentalists who are pursuing a career in professional performance in classical music.

The Trench Award aims to assist an emerging singer or instrumentalist in developing their professional career through further study at home or abroad. The bursary will be awarded to a student attending, or having been offered a confirmed place at a University/Conservatoire/Young Artist Programme/other specialist music institute undertaking classical music studies, either instrumental or vocal, in pursuit of a career in professional performance.

Six finalists will be invited to attend Birr Festival of Music from **Friday 1 May - Monday 4 May 2026**, and to perform a 15-minute programme at The Trench Award Gala Concert at Birr Theatre & Arts Centre, Birr, Co. Offaly on **Sunday 3 May 2025** when The Trench Award and other bursaries will be awarded by an international selection panel.

Applicants must be from the general Midlands/Midwest region of Ireland. While there is no upper age limit, applicants should be enrolled in an undergraduate or postgraduate programme in Music Performance, participating in a Young Artist Programme, or less than two years of completing their studies.

As the purpose and priorities of the award is to help artists develop their craft, applicants should not be undertaking a significant level of professional work and should be very clearly identifiable as 'emerging' artists.

The Trench Award is €5000.

In addition to being a promotional tool for events taking place throughout Tipperary, this online festival calendar will also facilitate organisers in planning event dates by providing an accessible reference point for as many of the County's Cultural, Community and Sporting events as possible, acting as a "clash" calendar for organisers when setting dates for festivals and events.

The calendar is easy to use and organisers can register their events on the website. Cultural, Community and Sporting events are categorised under a range of headings and users may search by date or type of event. Categories include: Arts; Children's; Family; Comedy; Exhibitions; Fairs; Shows; Markets; Festival; Film; Heritage; Historical; Lectures; Readings; Music; Theatre, Sports & Outdoors.
