Culture Night is an annual all-island public event that celebrates culture, creativity and the arts. An arrange of organisations present hundreds of **FREE** events, tours, talks and performances for you, your family and friends to enjoy.

This year, Culture Night will be celebrated on Friday 18 September.

It will take place from 4pm till late.

Building on the great success of previous years and coordinated by Tipperary County Council, we are now inviting arts and culture organisations, creative practitioners, artists, performers, community groups and schools to hold an event.

Will funding be available?

The deadline for funding applications is 12 noon on Thursday 18 June 2026.

You will be notified if you have been successful with your application in early July 2026.

If your event does not need funding, please also fill in the application form, as the Tipperary Arts office is coordinating all Culture Night events in County Tipperary and we want to make sure your event is promoted on the national website to reach a maximum audience!

If you do not require funding, the deadline does not apply, you can fill out the application form on an ongoing basis.

PFGi Poetry Award

PFGi, in partnership with Poetry Ireland / Éigse Éireann, has announced the launch of the inaugural PFGi Poetry Award 2026. This new poetry bursary and commission invites poets to explore the relationship between engineering, creativity and language.

Facilitated by Business to Arts, this new award offers a combined bursary and commission to support a poet living on the island of Ireland in the development of new work. The award includes a €5,000 bursary to support creative time, a €2,000 commission fee to the poet and €1,500 allocated to programme administration and delivery by Poetry Ireland / Éigse Éireann.

The award reflects a shared belief that engineering and poetry, while often viewed as distinct disciplines, are both grounded in imagination, structure, and the shaping of ideas into form. Through this initiative, PFGi and Poetry Ireland / Éigse Éireann aim to create space for dialogue between disciplines, inviting a poet to respond to themes that connect technical precision with human experience.

New Grants Announced for Community Centre upgrades.

The Minister for Rural and Community Development, Dara Calleary TD, has announced the fourth round of funding under the Community Centre Investment Fund (CCIF) aimed at enhancing existing community centres.

Following previous funding rounds totalling over €111m, the new 2026 scheme will accept online applications starting 29th May, with a **closing date of 13th July**.

Grants range from €10,000 to €100,000, covering various refurbishment projects.

Applicant groups must register online and are encouraged to prepare their applications in advance. Information sessions will be held to assist with the application process.

Minister Calleary urged groups to take advantage of this funding opportunity to improve their community facilities.

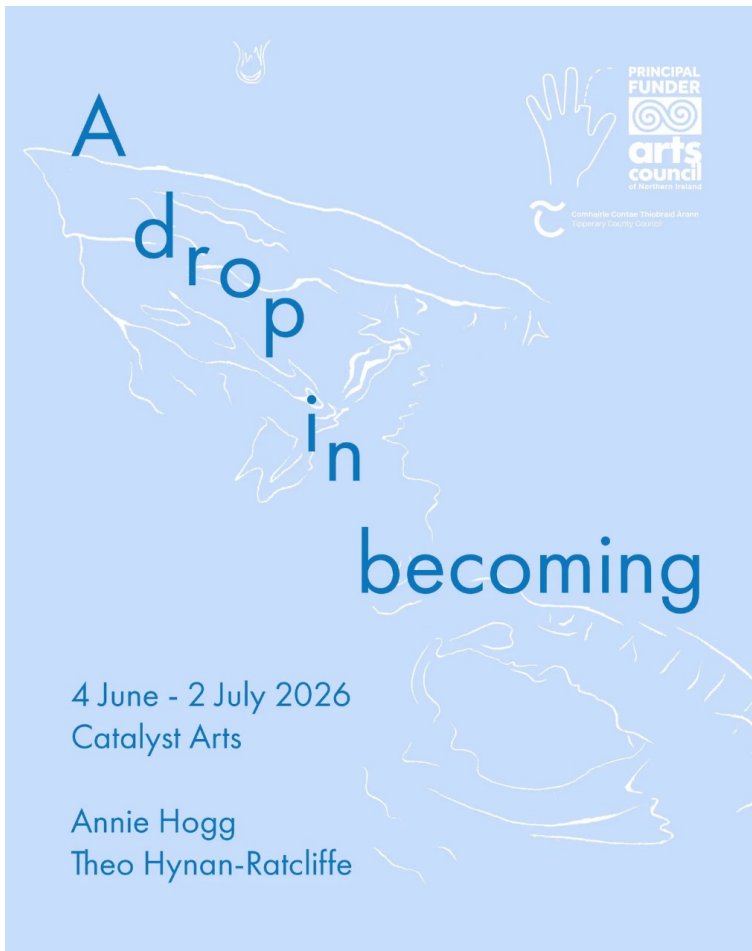

[A drop in becoming](#) is a living exhibition, transforming over the course of a month in response to the temporal world we inhabit. Featuring the works of Annie Hogg and Theo Hynan-Ratcliffe, sculptures dissolve, absorb, and digest in an ever-changing encounter. The artists employ sustainable techniques and hand-harvested materials in intimate communication with their natural surroundings that question our changing relationship to the earth. Audiences are invited to become participants in the gallery space as the works engage all five of their senses.

Annie Hogg's work explores the microscopic world of Archaea, single-celled organisms that are the closest living relatives to the Last Universal Common Ancestor (LUCA). Actions and reactions are fabricated in natural materials to mirror those performed by Archaea in their crucial role over planetary boundaries and health. Theo Hynan-Ratcliffe utilises sculpture and fiction to explore how we become from place through our mineral exchange with home, land, and the matter we share it with. Visitors are invited to absorb place through consumption, touch, and conversation with material.

The exhibition is accompanied by an events programme that engages the audience in active listening, slow looking, creative writing, and speculative thinking. Events are all free to attend, [please click here for the full events programme and to book tickets.](#)

This new body of textile work explores Sacred Geometry through carefully considered colour, shape and pattern, each chosen for symbolic resonance. Drawing on the archetypes of Maiden, Mother and Crone, Stevens uses the tradition of Mandala making to reflect the shifting roles and identities of women across time and generations.

Using materials belonging to daughter, mother and grandmother, the work honours the cyclical and interconnected nature of womanhood. Embedded within the textiles are personal and collective histories, celebrating traditions of patchwork and sewing while acknowledging often overlooked forms of creative expression.

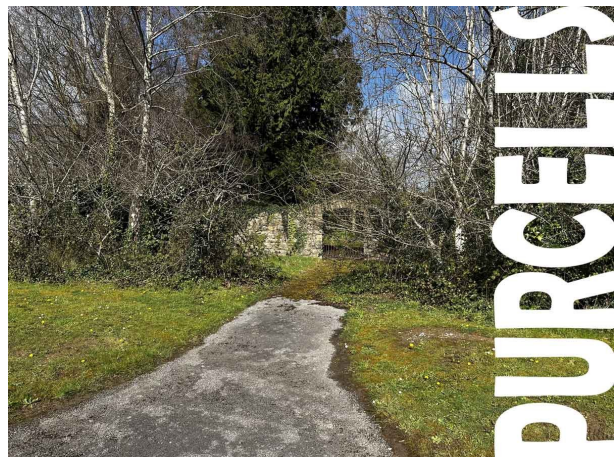

In addition to being a promotional tool for events taking place throughout Tipperary, this online festival calendar will also facilitate organisers in planning event dates by providing an accessible reference point for as many of the County's Cultural, Community and Sporting events as possible, acting as a "clash" calendar for organisers when setting dates for festivals and events.

The calendar is easy to use and organisers can register their events on the website. Cultural, Community and Sporting events are categorised under a range of headings and users may search by date or type of event. Categories include: Arts; Children's; Family; Comedy; Exhibitions; Fairs; Shows; Markets; Festival; Film; Heritage; Historical; Lectures; Readings; Music; Theatre, Sports & Outdoors.
