Media Update

Slievenamon Fire Update – Tuesday Morning

Firefighting crews remain on site at Slievenamon this morning following overnight operations.

Conditions improved significantly overnight. A drone survey conducted by Coillte personnel early this morning confirmed that the adjacent forestry area does not appear to be affected by fire. The firebreaks that were previously established have proven effective in protecting the forestry plantation. Coillte staff will continue to monitor the area throughout the day.

An inspection of the mountain this morning initially suggested that the fire was largely under control. However, as fog began to clear after 7.30am, areas of active combustion became visible on Slievenamon Bog near the summit, and efforts are now focused on suppressing these remaining hotspots.

Aerial fire-fighting support has been requested and is expected to commence operations later this morning. Water will be drawn from an identified local source to support these operations.

Today's response will concentrate on containing and extinguishing the remaining fire activity on the bog. Ground and aerial resources will continue to assess conditions as visibility improves.

Current weather conditions are favourable, with wind direction assisting firefighting efforts and temperatures expected to remain moderate through the morning, providing a valuable operational window for crews.

Fire crews worked monitored conditions throughout the night and are continuing operations today. Further updates will be provided as the situation develops.
